EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLANS

Emergency response plans are a method of preparing for worst case scenarios. A good emergency response plan should include details regarding how to protect the 3 P's: People: Planet: Profit.

People: includes protecting staff, customers, bystanders, & first responders. This should be the most important element in the ERP (emergency response plan).

Planet: includes how to mitigate impact to surrounding areas including neighboring buildings, and water bodies.

Profit: includes how to mitigate damage to buildings & assets.

If you do not have an ERP, start one today, or update or review your existing ERP. (You could protect some volunteer firefighter someday!)
